INTRODUCTION

It is always a matter of pride for Azad foundation, to see the trainees graduating with flying colors and start their careers in the domain of a nontraditional livelihood. Being a feminist organization, working with urban resource poor women, Azad believes that when women are socially and economically empowered, they become a catalyst of change; not just for their own life but also for their families and communities. By providing nontraditional livelihood options to women, Azad aims to challenge the stereotypical belief of the society that women cannot work in this sector and it's a male dominant market. The objective of the organization is to establish a cadre of empowered professional women chauffeurs who can take charge of their own lives as well as create a safe transport solution for other women. Azad wants to see underprivileged women as empowered professionals who would earn "Livelihoods with Dignity" in the transport sector and at the same time Azad also wants to create a gender just ecosystem and gender sensitive markets which would ultimately help the women to negotiate and sustain their workforce participation. Since Azad's focus is to create "livelihoods with Dignity" for women who have been living on the margins of society. This requires not only skills and knowhow but also the confidence to claim the public space, the ability to negotiate a masculine domain of work. Women across class, caste and communities have to face tremendous reproductive responsibilities, violence, discrimination and harassment at home, on roads and at workplaces which limits their time and ability for paid work. A training program geared to create sustainable livelihoods in the non-traditional sector which is majorly dominated by men, will create capabilities of negotiation and bargaining power. With this thought and belief Azad's training curriculum spans three kinds of modules: technical skill based module leading to acquisition of Permanent license and clearance of Sakha test after which trainee is declared employable, self-development module that aims at developing women's identity as a confident professional and the empowerment module that aims at enabling the trainee to understand her social location and the structure of patriarchy leading to build courage and strategies to counter and resist multiple oppressions. Yearbook 2021-22 is an endeavor by Azad foundation to present the record of all the trainees who underwent the journey of a rigorous training and have successfully acquired their permanent driving license across Delhi, Kolkata, Jaipur and Chennai during the period of April 2021-March 2022. Under the flagship program of Azad that is "women with wheels" 'in the year 2021-22, total 206 trainees got their permanent license made. Total 206 trainees successfully acquired the license both for 2 wheelers and 4 wheeler vehicles. Out of 206 trainees who achieved the permanent license 113 achieved it for 4 wheelers and 93 achieved it for 2 wheelers. Each trainee in the system comes in with her unique story, challenges, experience and struggle, and hence for Azad it is very important to celebrate the achievement of trainee, who put in a lot of effort to break the chains, each trainee is very precious and this year book is a tribute to the achievements of our trainees which offer glimpse of each of these women's story of effort and change.

The work-readiness session was very useful for her, where she learnt the importance of dressing up neatly, being hygienic and punctual. he had always lived monotonously and never truly enjoyed the beauty of living her life to the fullest, but now she is able to unfold the true meanings of life.

Adhilakshmi joined the 2-wheeler training because it had been a long standing wish of her to learn driving. She came to know about azad from door to door survey conducted in her locality. It appeared to her as an opportunity to not only get her Permanent License but also find a decent source of income. Though she considers herself to be a bold woman, there was always a strange fear inside her when she traveled alone in the bus. But after attending the self-defense session she felt safe knowing she could face any situation bravely. She was happy and content to get permanent license as it was not an easy task. During legal training she was surprised to know that there are so many laws that are made for women which provide her the necessary confidence to face problems, even within her family. She dreams of saving money for her future and building her own house.

Her husband was also a little intimidated and opposed her decision of joining Azad, because he felt it was not safe, but she convinced him and now he appreciates her decision. She liked the sessions on professionalism and self-defense the most because she understood the importance of time management and punctuality in her life. The self-defense sessions gave her confidence to face any adverse situation especially while traveling alone. She understands that it is important for women to earn so that they become financially independent.

dayarani never thought that she can ever become a driver and can get a driving license. It was an opportunity, when she got a chance to learn 2-wheeler through Azad's WWW program. She says riding a 2-wheeler is a powerful skill. She likes to help people in need, in her locality she has been helping people get their documents done, registering FIRs etc. So, when she heard that she can learn legal rights, first aid and self-defense she was interested as she could help people with the knowledge. Although she is bold, there was a lingering fear of traveling to unknown places. But, after attending these training sessions she was confident enough to do so. The traings she attended made her feel proud of herself for having learnt so many new things. Learning to ride a 2-wheeler increased her inner strength and confidence. Her attitude to help others encouraged her to take up the role of mobiliser for the WWW program. Now she rides her 2-wheeler vehicle to the community and encourages women to join the program.

That is why she wishes to one day get a job for which she was trained and make her own identity in society so that her in-laws get convinced that there is nothing wrong for a woman to work in a field conventionally made for men.

uja came across a surveyor who provided contact details of Azad Foundation and suggested her to join. Puja wanted to start earning to become self-sufficient as well as help secure the future of her son so she decided to join Azad. After doing her training, she felt that she was stronger than she was before, on a mental and emotional level. She can face her fears in a much better way than she could before.
