We are committed to breaking patriarchal boundaries and structures so that the women can exercise control over their lives and live a life of dignity.


We do this through transformative capacity building programs around the self and the skills needed for NTL, based on adult learning principles.

The attempt is to document the journey of these women, the challenges they face both within and outside the training and in their personal lives. Furthermore, it explores the moments of fearlessness and realization of self-esteem of the women during the course of training.

She left this and joined the WoW programme because it was exciting for her. She says that this decision changed her life. She feels her mobility has increased and she is able to talk to new people. The Dance Movement Therapy classes and Gender and VAW training have helped her have more faith in her abilities. She wants to become a good driver, earn money and make a house for herself.
